Art and DT teaching is often linked to our termly project themes and concepts so that children develop ideas, master practical skills and can draw inspiration from their learning across all subjects. However, we also believe in the power that an 'Art Week' can have in inspiring creativity and building excitement around a project so this is also an approach fostered for delivering our exciting curriculum.

Implementation:

How do we do it at Tadpole Farm CEPA?

In both KS1 and KS2, we believe in the benefit of continuing the practice of encouraging independence and celebrating differences as fostered in EYFS. Working in a project format across both art and DT allows for this and encourages children to take pride in producing beautiful sketchbooks which perfectly demonstrate and document their creative journey. In KS1, emphasis is placed on investigating colour as well as exploring a range of different mediums including a variety of paint, model making and sketching. In KS2, we continue the foundations laid in KS1 by encouraging the children to lead their own scheme of work. The children engage in the project process by exploring artists in greater depth and creating artist response pages, looking more
