Development Matters 3&4 Yr Olds - Nursery Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks. · Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan. · Use one-handed tools and equipment, for example, making snips in paper with scissors. · Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. Explore different materials freely, in order to develop their ideas about how to use them and what to make. · Develop their own ideas and then decide which materials to use to express them. · Join different materials and explore different textures. · Create closed shapes with continuous lines, and begin to use these shapes to represent objects. · Draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details. · Use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises. · Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings, like happiness, sadness, fear, etc. · Explore colour and colour mixing.
